Language requirements

English is the language of instruction at Erasmus School of Economics. Exchange students are expected to have an English proficiency level of at least:

- B2 Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR)
- 90 Academic TOEFL
- 6.5 Academic IETLS

If your study programme is taught in English a statement from your home university is sufficient proof. Otherwise, a certificate is required.

Application procedure

Student or International Office of home university completes online application with the required documents:

- Official nomination letter of partner university
- Transcript of records (including sufficient knowledge in Economics, Statistics and Mathematics)
All students should have completed at least one year of their Bachelor's degree programme before applying.
- English B2 level Certificate (CEFR) or equivalent

Course information

Erasmus School of Economics offers 3rd year Bachelor courses to exchange students. Master courses are only possible when specifically agreed upon with the partner university.

Students are advised to take on a study workload of approximately 12 ECTS per block. One semester consists of two blocks. Students will be informed about course registration by e-mail.

Preparing for your exchange

Visa

Most international students from outside the EU/EEA, studying in the Netherlands for more than 90 days, need to apply for an entry visa and/or a Dutch residence permit. Housing

The Official Welcome Ceremony is organised by the university for all international students and consists of two parts. The formal part with speeches by prominent university staff and student associations and a performance by a popular stand-up comedian. And an informal part, where you will have the chance to experience true Dutch cuisine.

Financial information

Experience has shown that students living and studying in Rotterdam spend approximately €1,000 a month. This amount is needed to cover daily expenses, meals, accommodation costs, insurance, etc.
