	Students
	Comprehensive program designed for short-term international students coming to Keio based on an exchange agreement with the Faculty of Economics and/or the Graduate School of Economics. *Students in this Undergraduate Program can take courses offered by the Faculty of Economics as well as KIP and Japanese language courses. (Japanese language courses: up to 4 subjects per semester)
	Postgraduate Research Program
	Graduate-level program for graduate students who wish to conduct research under the supervision of an academic advisor and/or to take courses at Keio University.
	*Students in the Postgraduate Research Program are eligible to take the courses in the Faculty of Economics, the Graduate School of Economics as well as the international center courses and Japanese language courses. (Japanese language courses: up to 4 subjects per semester)

November	May-June	Confirmation of application documents by the Keio exchange student selection committee.
Mid-December	Mid-June	Once accepted, a notification of acceptance will be sent to the exchange coordinator by email.

Mid-February	Late July	Keio will send the students the Certificate of Eligibility as soon as it arrives from the Immigration Bureau – please submit this certificate when applying for a student visa at the Japanese Embassy or consulate.

LIVING EXPENSES

Monthly living costs	Taking utilities, food, clothes, transportation, books and miscellaneous expenses into consideration, monthly living costs should come to about ¥130,000 - ¥170,000.
Example	Keio Housing*: ¥51,000(room only) - ¥78,000 (breakfast and dinner inclusive for weekdays) *Utilities included Food: ¥30,000 - ¥60,000 Clothes: ¥10,000 - ¥20,000 Books: ¥7,000 Transportation: ¥8,000+ Medical Insurance: ¥1,500 Cellular Phone: ¥5,000+ Miscellaneous: ¥15,000
Important Notes:	It is important that students have enough funding to cover the expected costs of their stay at Keio, which should be at least \$130,000 (or equivalent in the student's currency) per month for the expected period of stay (six months or eleven months). It is very difficult for exchange students to apply for a scholarship after they come to Japan. It is also difficult for exchange students to get a part-time job.

HOUSING

Availability of university dormitories	There are several accommodations subsidized by Keio. Upon request, the administrative staff assists exchange students in applying for the dormitories.
Rent (subject to change)	The rent charged to students varies from ¥51,000 - ¥78,000 (subject to change). Residents will also be charged non – refundable deposit.

Application procedures for housing	We will send housing information and application procedures to students together with their acceptance letter.
Additional important information	No airport pick-up services are provided for students. Detailed directions will be given by e-mail after the student's dormitory is confirmed.
